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# **Executive Summary of My Proposal**

#### Introduction

My name is Tino Sequeira. I've built my career as a technical writer and proposal specialist, preparing business requirements, funding applications, RFPs, and technical briefs for organizations across IT and non-profit projects. Over time, I realized that my strongest skills—researching, writing persuasively, and organizing complex information—are the same skills that drive success in grant writing and fundraising. I'm passionate about using my writing and relationship-building abilities to secure funding that directly supports people and communities.

#### "Why should you hire me?"

I even had to develop a Model that would show the funder that the school was serious to come up with a solution to align with the terms of the funding. This was for Micro-credential funding where the schools were expected to provide micro courses to meet the needs of the employers. The school did not have the resources to come up with a solution.

I believe that is my strength to think outside the box and come up with a solution when I meet with obstacles.

The proposal was approved, and the organization secured funding that helped them expand services. What I learned from that experience is the importance of aligning the proposal with both the organization's goals and the funder's priorities—a principle I would bring to **XYZ COLLEGE**.

As you know, Canada is experiencing a significant shortage of skilled construction workers, with high demand across housing, infrastructure, and industrial projects. This shortage is driven by an aging workforce, declining interest in skilled trades, and high vacancy rates, creating a critical barrier to meeting housing and infrastructure needs. To address this, the government and industry are focusing on increasing immigration, improving training programs, and encouraging more diverse groups to enter the trades.

# **Key Factors Contributing to the Shortage**

#### Aging Workforce:

Many experienced construction workers are retiring, creating a large gap in the skilled labor pool.

#### • Declining Interest in Trades:

Fewer young workers are entering the trades, and apprenticeship completion rates are low, preventing the pool of new talent from growing sufficiently.

#### High Project Demand:

Canada is facing a severe housing crisis and has ambitious infrastructure goals, which require a massive increase in construction activity and, therefore, skilled workers.

#### High Vacancy Rates:

The construction sector consistently reports high job vacancy rates, with positions staying open longer than the national average, indicating a struggle to fill roles. Impact of the Shortage

#### Housing Affordability:

The shortage directly impedes efforts to build enough homes to address the housing crisis, making it harder to restore affordability.

### • Increased Project Costs and Timelines:

A lack of skilled labor leads to longer construction times and higher project costs.

Addressing the Shortage

#### • Increased Immigration:

Immigrant workers with construction skills are seen as essential to meeting demand, especially as federal immigration targets are revised.

#### • Improved Training and Apprenticeships:

Strengthening and promoting apprenticeship programs is crucial to training a new generation of skilled workers.

#### Diversifying the Workforce:

Employers are encouraged to recruit from underrepresented groups, including women, Indigenous peoples, and newcomers, to expand the talent pipeline.

#### Technological Innovation:

Exploring and implementing technological solutions can also help improve efficiency and alleviate some labor pressures.

# "How would you approach fundraising for XYZ COLLEGE?"

My first step would be to map out potential funding sources—government programs that support workforce development, foundations with an interest in training and employment, and corporate partners in the construction industry. Then, I'd work on building tailored sponsorship packages for industry partners, showing them, how supporting XYZ COLLEGE directly benefits their sector by creating a skilled workforce. I'd also focus on building and maintaining relationships—regular updates, impact reports, and recognition go a long way in keeping funders engaged. Over time, this approach not only brings in funding but creates long-term partners who see XYZ COLLEGE's success as their own.

# "Do you have experience with the Canadian funding landscape?"

Yes. I'm familiar with how federal, provincial, and municipal programs support training and workforce development. For example, Employment and Social Development Canada (ESDC) funds skills and training initiatives, provinces often have workforce development and retraining grants, and municipalities can support local employment programs. I also know that industry associations and private foundations in Canada are increasingly interested in skills development and equity in employment. While each funder is unique, I'm confident in my ability to research opportunities, understand the eligibility requirements, and craft strong applications.

Federally, Employment and Social Development Canada (ESDC) funds workforce development and skills training. At the provincial level, there are retraining and skills initiatives, while municipalities often fund local employment programs. Beyond government, I'd also target construction companies, unions, and industry associations who want to support workforce growth.
